




pollution.



The different biomes in Russia determine the areas of the country that are inhabited - many of the coastal areas in the north are uninhabited due to the conditions being unsuitable.

Russia is located across 2 continents, Asia and Europe. It is the largest country on earth by size 17.08 million km 2 , so big that is has 11 different time zones. It is bordered by 14 countries and 2 oceans. The capital of Russia is Moscow and is home to several different biomes. Including Tundra, temperate woodland and desert.
