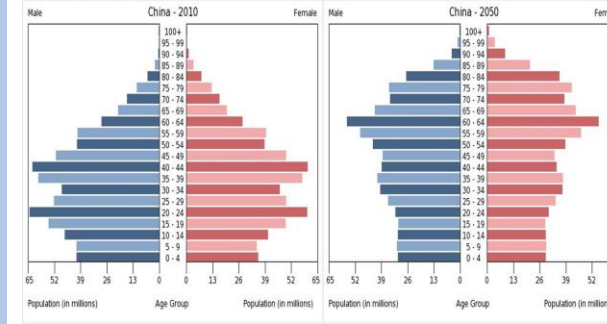
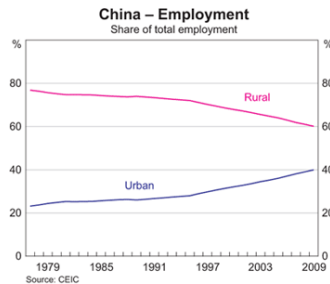

China is experiencing high levels of rural to urban migration. This is when people leave the countryside and move to the city. This is caused by higher wages and a better quality of life in urban areas (cities)



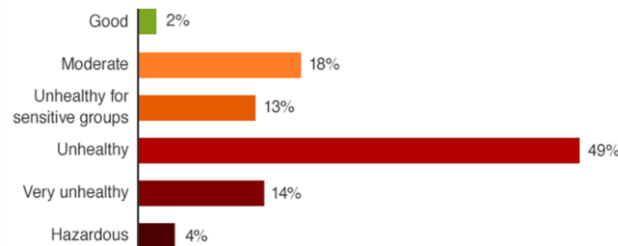

China is constantly struggling with poor quality air. Unhealthy air quality was recoded in Beijing 49% of the time, with hazardous air recorded 4% of the time. Over population and fewer restrictions on factory emissions results in China's air pollution.

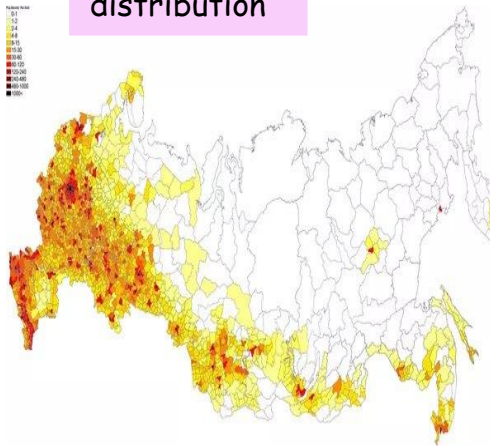
