Key Vocabulary – Definitions and examples.	
KEY WORD	DEFINITION
<b>discrimination</b>	Unfair treatment because of a person's characteristic.
<b>prejudice</b>	Preconceived idea about someone because of a characteristic, not based on fact or experience.
<b>stereotype</b>	Putting someone into a category because of a trait they have.
<b>dialect</b>	Language used in a specific area.
<b>colloquialism</b>	Informal words or phrases.
<b>versatile</b>	Adaptable and changeable.
<b>radicalisation</b>	Causing someone to have radical ideas on religion or politics.
<b>extremism</b>	Having extreme views on religion and politics.
<b>idealism</b>	Unrealistic expectations for perfection.
<b>condemnation</b>	Very strong disapproval.
<b>heinous</b>	Extremely wicked or atrocious.
<b>injustice</b>	Unfair, lacks justice.
<b>disparity</b>	Great differences.
<b>phenomenal</b>	Remarkable, exceptional, or extremely good.
<b>segregation</b>	Setting things apart.
<b>impinge</b>	Creating a negative effect.
<b>impairment</b>	Having a disability of a specific kind.
