Omnipotent - All powerful Omnipresent - Always present Omniscient - All knowing

Transcendent - God is outside of our world and above all human understanding.



Brahma (Creator) Vishnu (preserver)


All 3 religions which you will study (Christianity, Hinduism and Islam) all believe in **1 God** – this is called **Monotheism**.


