UNIVERSAL SIGNS

Many workplaces use a series of signs and symbols to convey a complete **message**.

Universal signs are used worldwide to keep everybody safe regardless of their language, if the sign was written.

Colours and shapes are important too as this helps to highlight potential hazards and dangers.

RED CIRCLE

Danger. Stop.

YELLOW TRIANGLE

Warning. Be careful; take precautions

GREEN RECTANGLE

Emergency escape. First aid. No danger

BLUE CIRCLE

Mandatory. Specific behaviour or action e.g. wear personal protective equipment. Must be followed.



Wear ear protectors



Fire escape keep clear



Protective footwear must be worn



Eye protection must be worn



Wear gloves



All visitors and drivers must report to reception

Keeping safe in the workshop: -
